


CREATING THE MEETING ROOM

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
WHAT MAKES A MODERN MEETING ROOM?

 a frustrating issue which can seriously affect attendee engagement.

- Connection problems, including drops on calls a costly time-waster, which can be easily resolved with the right equipment.
- Low-quality audio, including volume issues, reverb and background noise – this can give a poor impression and can be easily fixed with the latest equipment.
- Different technology in different rooms, making usage more complicated than necessary.
- Separate systems for voice, video and data collaboration an unnecessary complication which can be remedied with an upgrade.

This will make connecting to meeting resources simple and secure.




Integrated cameras, speakers and microphone arrays:

Room control panels:

These can make quite complex systems easy to use, allowing the host to set up various requirements, including dimming lights, shutting blinds, turning on screens and dialling external participants.

HOW TO CHOOSE THE RIGHT INTERACTIVE PANELS FOR YOUR MEETING ROOM?

As is often the case when implementing a new IT solution, the variety you have to choose from can be staggering. Your business size, sector, applications and software all have an impact when deciding upon the most appropriate interactive panels for your organisation's meeting rooms.

First and foremost, you need to consider your users, and think about what your teams use the screens for. If your business will only be annotating Office-based systems, like Word or PowerPoint, your requirements are going to be different to a specialist business that needs to annotate bespoke applications. Different interactive panels support different annotation tools, so matching the right screen to fit individual collaboration, education and training environments is key to success and ROI.

It is also important to note that some panels, such as Clevertouch, the Avocor Windows Collaboration Display (WCD) series and Cisco Webex Boards, have built-in cameras and microphones for video collaboration, and work with other communication tools, such as Microsoft Teams or Cisco Webex Teams.

SIMPLE TOOLS ENABLE GREAT COLLABORATION

Being able to communicate easily and effectively is critical for successful collaboration. If your meeting participants aren't all present physically, as is now the norm, it is essential that you provide the means to collaborate with complete ease over distance, by supplying tools such as unified communication platforms, including videoconferencing capabilities.

In the past, videoconferencing tools could be so overly intricate and difficult to use that they were often the bane of many a meeting. It is therefore vital that you employ user-friendly technology, and the key to this is that whatever you have in your meeting room should be an extension of what employees are already using on their desktops, thus providing a familiar interface.

With an all-in-one unified communications system in place across your meeting rooms, participants only need to access a single platform for seamless collaboration.



Remember good audio quality is vital

Audio issues can completely negate the benefits of videoconferencing, therefore it's important to ensure all meeting rooms are equipped with a suitable solution to ensure the audio quality of your videoconferencing is crystal clear.



Headsets make all the difference

You may have the best audio equipment in the world, but if you are holding a videoconference with several participants, it only takes one remote worker to have background noise, such as a dog barking, for your whole meeting to be disrupted. It is therefore advisable to provide headsets to all employees, to minimise such noise.



Videoconference cameras for a professional image

In addition, you might want to consider investing in a videoconference camera, to project a more professional image. Although most laptops and PCs do include a built-in camera, they are often quite basic, with regards to resolution and image quality, as well as having limitations regarding viewing angles and controls. Specialist videoconference cameras can supply a better-quality experience, providing higher resolution and panoramic views of the meeting space. Such equipment also generally uses a USB connection, so is compatible with PCs and Macs, and can normally be used with most videoconferencing platforms.





Don't neglect your network

If you have insufficient network bandwidth to maintain your organisation's communication and collaboration tools, or if your wireless network isn't built to properly support the meeting room environment, your new technology will be limited. It's therefore vital you take the necessary steps to prevent this from being a problem.



Stay safe and secure

Maintaining security across your network should also always be a high priority. Employing separate guest Wi-Fi networks that are simple to access can prevent unauthorised access to your network resources, while maintaining a stable Internet connection for your guests. At the same time, considering how you secure your multi-site collaboration sessions can help prevent data interception when in transit and at rest.



Clear away cables

Input cables can be untidy and cause delays with set-up and presentation sharing. By making your meeting room environments wireless, you don't need to worry about recipients having the correct port on their endpoints to present, and swapping presenter can be as simple as pressing a button. So, for a much more seamless experience, consider using wireless presentation tools, such as Cisco Webex Share, Barco and Solstice.


